## M E M O R Y - Anterograde Memory

## INFORMATION ABOUT A DEAF MAN

> Respondents watch and recall in any order.
$>$ Score only the $3^{\text {rd }}$ trial
> Spelling PJ with lip pattern is OK. However, if initials without lip pattern or if they use shortened version like Phil then ask for full name.
> If they say 'Lives Margate' or 'School Sheffield' these are scored as errors.
$>$ Names do not have to be spelt correctly but it must be clear that they intend correct target

> Name does not have to be spelt correctly as long as it is clear that they intend the correct answer.
> Just surname is OK (eg Cameron or Thatcher)
> If they only give first name only (eg David or Maggie) ask for surname as well.

- First name of the Queen?

## L A N G U A G E - Picture Naming



Point to show respondent to start at top and go $L$ to $R$.
> Only award a point if they then give an acceptable sign (any regional sign is OK).
$>$ If response is fingerspelled or spoken- ask respondent for the sign. If they then give sign score 1.
> If they cannot give a sign, score 0 and ask them if they never knew the sign or whether they just can't remember it
> Important: Do not give clues or provide correct answers if errors are made
$>$ Watch for visual, semantic or phonological errors on this task

## BSL VERBALLEARNINGANDMEMORYTEST(BSLVLMT)

$>$ Video provides list of signs to remember
$>$ Respondent watches and repeats back in any order. This is done 3 times, even if the responses are all correct
> This allows respondent to learn the list
> Respondents are not allowed to rehearse items during presentation
$>$ Counting the items on their fingers during presentation is allowed on this task


Remind respondent at start of trial 2 and 3 to: 'tell me ALL the items again' (ie not just the ones they didn't remember on the last trial)
$>$ If they appear to be trying to recall the list in order, remind them 'order does not matter'


When respondent appears to be finished, wait 10 seconds before asking ‘Do you remember any more?'


Record all responses on each trial. Verify your scoring with the video recording.

Please make sure that the respondent is signing clearly so the camera can see their responses.

## DIGITSPAN-FORWARDS


> Video instructions asks Respondents to sign 1-10 to familiarise you with their number signs
> START with practice item
> Correct answers for each trial are shown in bold. Score 0 or 1
> Each item has two trials
$\gg$ STOP if both trials for an item are failed
> You may have to remind respondent to wait until they see the blank screen before recalling the numbers
> Direct respondent attention by pointing to the screen for the duration of each number string


If respondent does not understand task, repeat the video instructions or sign
 'You will see numbers flash up on the screen, watch carefully and sign them back to me'


Make sure their number signs are clear and visible to the camera

## MATRIXREASONING(WASI)

START with practice items A \& $B$. Then items 1-32
> Correct answers are shown in bold. Score 0 or 1
$>$ STOP after 4 errors in a row or 4 errors on 5 consecutive items
> If respondent is aged 80+ years stop after 28 items
> If respondent does not understand task repeat the video instructions.
> Or sign,
'See there is a piece missing, look and see which piece should go there. Point clearly to show me your choice'

NOTE: This form is for research with ages 50-89 only. Use WASI norms for hearing people. For younger respondents check WASI instructions.


## B S L V L M T -DELAYED RECALL

> Video asks respondent to recall list of signs.


When respondent appears to be finished recalling, wait 10 seconds before asking 'Do you remember any more?'
$\rightarrow$ E
If they do not remember the task, say, 'Not Deaf man, Not Ball Pen Tree. Different task. Woman on video signed a lot of signs for you to try and remember. You did this three times and said them back. Do you remember the task? Try to tell me as many signs as you can.'
> If they still do not remember, go straight to BSLT RECOGNITION


Testing time interval in minutes $\square$ This should be $>20$ minutes

> DVD asks which signs were given in original list
> Respondent watches and says YES or NO
$>$ If they are not sure or don't know, encourage them to guess YES or NO
$>$ If they do not understand task explain, 'Say YES if woman on video signed it before, say NO if it is new sign and she didn't sign it before'
